# Three Tiger Players on All-Ohio Club

Gillom, Slusser and Russell Picked on A-P High School Eleven; Beer on Second Squad.

COLUMBUS (AP)—The royal purple robe of gridiron greatness fell today around the broad shoulders of 11 youths—the No. 1 stars of the 16,000 boys who romped across the state's high school gridirons this fall—as they won places on the Associated Press All-Ohio honorary football team.

Sheer ability, reaction to coaching, sportsmanship, scholastic rating, strength on opponents, and personality—all these were taken into consideration in the nominations of 200 coaches and 100 sports writers.

The Associated Press All-Ohio high school team, to which every scholastic player on 441 teams in the state is eligible, is more difficult to "make" than the All-America college team.

The final analysis showed Massillon's powerhouse winner of 24 straight contests, with three men on the first team, one on the second and one on the third. Toledo Walte and Portsmouth, participants in Saturday's first annual Buckeye bowl game in Ohio State university's stadium, won two.

## HONOR CRIDDERS TONIGHT

Crestline high school officials and football fans will honor the school's undefeated and untied eleven at a banquet in the school cafeteria at 6:30 p. m. today. Don Peden, Ohio university football coach, will be the guest speaker.

Berths each on the first team, while single positions went to Lima South, Washington Court House, Hamilton and Lorain.

Paul Sarringhaus, unbeaten Hamilton's ace ball-toter, kicker and passer, was chosen the state's outstanding player, by a narrow margin. Right on Sarringhaus' heels were such luminaries as Horace Gillom, Massillon's fine Negro end; George Slusser, Massillon quarterback; Rack Martin, Toledo Walte's center, and John Willis, Lorain's colored fullback, all of whom won first-team berths.

The first string lineup stacks up like a college team. The forward wall averages 192 pounds while the backs average 178.

Langdon (Corky) McCoy, passing catching end for Washington Court House, was the state's punting phenomenon. The tall 175-pounder hooped the ball 41 times for 1,890 yards, an average of 46. He got off several 85-yard kicks out of bounds, and rapped one 80 yards from behind his own goal line.
